- 16 DEPUTY DIRECTOR MCGRAIL: Thank you,

- 18 We have several presentations today, and I'd
- 19 like to start, first of all, with Jim McClure.
- 20 This is recognition for ten years of service
- 21 with the Missouri Gaming Commission. Jim had retired
- 22 from the Secretary of State's Office. He's our
- 23 historian for rules and regulations, so he's the one
- 24 that we rely on many times as far as the process on
- 25 that, so it's something that we hold him very dearly to

1 and rely on him very much.

2 So thank you for being here and the ten years

3 of service.

- 4 MR. MCCLURE: Thank you.
- 5 (Applause.)

6 DEPUTY DIRECTOR MCGRAIL: There's two others

7 we want to recognize for your service.

8 Tammy, would you come forward, and Rachel as

9 well.

10 One on each side.

11 So this is a significant milestone. This is

12 25 years with the Missouri Gaming Commission.

13 So Rachel Farr is in our bingo unit. She's

14 been there basically since we've had bingo with the

15 Commission. She's done just about everything with

16 bingo. We rely on her, as well as the rest of the

17 staff, to make sure -- realizing that they go out to

18 these charitable and fraternal organizations, and most

19 of the time they are going through boxes. There is no

20 automation with this. So they're looking at many

21 receipts, making sure that they're accurate and complete

22 and partly that we're getting our tax money from that.

23 So again, we recognize Rachel for 25 years

24 of distinguished service as well.

25 (Applause.)

1 DEPUTY DIRECTOR MCGRAIL: Tammy.

2	So Tammy has 25 years as well. Tammy is the
3	administrative assistant for our enforcement, but she
4	has done about everything within the Gaming Commission
5	as well. Many of you people recognize her name, Tammy
6	Morre, because you're the one that sends her all of the
7	e-mails and correspondence, and sometimes, like I say,
8	it gets back to you if it requires that. So she's kind
9	of our traffic cop. So she handles much of this to make
10	sure that these people here are getting the work done so
11	that she can get it back and get it to you correct.
12	So again, we wanted to recognize her for all
13	of her years of services as well, 25 years.
14	(Applause.)
15	DEPUTY DIRECTOR MCGRAIL: One more.
16	As we always do, we recognize an MGC employee
17	of the quarter. So if I could have Jeff Thomas to come
18	forward.
19	So many of you recognize, at least on the
20	west side of the state, Kansas City and St. Jo, and I
21	think Boonville recognizes Jeff.
22	Jeff has been designated as our employee of
23	the quarter by his peers for his upbeat and friendly
24	attitude. Jeff is one of the auditors in charge of
25	Kansas City and can be trusted to complete a task

1	thoroughly and timely. He maintains a great working
2	relationship with his co-workers even after stepping up
3	into the supervisory position, and he maintains that
4	same relationship with the casino personnel. Right?
5	Okay. He has volunteered to do whatever is
6	necessary since the first week of his employment with
7	the Missouri Gaming Commission in February of 2015. He
8	definitely applies the core value of service, integrity
9	and professionalism to his daily work. Jeff is a valued
10	employee, and we congratulate him on the employee of the
11	quarter.

18	CHAIRMAN LEARA: Thank you.
19	The next item is Consideration of Licensure
20	on Class A Licensee and Petition for Change of Control,
21	and we will move right to the presentation, or do you
22	have
23	EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR GROTHAUS: No. We'll move
24	right to the presentation if they want to present.
25	CHAIRMAN LEARA: Would someone like to come

1 forward?)
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2 State your name and you have the floor.
3 MR. HOETZINGER: Thank you very much.
4 Good morning, Mr. Chairman, Commissioners,
5 staff. My name is Peter Hoetzinger. I'm the co-founder
6 and Co CEO of Century Casinos. With me today are Erwin
7 Haitzmann, Chairman and CEO of the company, and Margaret
8 Stapleton, Chief Financial Officer. We are here today
9 to ask for your approval to license and operate two
10 casinos in your great state.
11 Please allow me to give some background on
12 Century Casinos.
13 The company was founded in 1992 as a
14 developer of mid-size, mid-market casinos. We have
15 today 2,300 employees and will grow to 3,500 with this
16 transaction. We've been listed on Nasdaq since '94. In
17 April of last year we celebrated our 25 listing
18 anniversary.
19 The core management team is Erwin Haitzmann,
20 myself and Margaret Stapleton. Erwin and I founded the
21 company in 1992, and we both did nothing but developing
22 and operating casinos all our professional lives. We
23 started with European game companies, and then with the
24 proliferation of gaming in the U.S. we founded Century
25 Casinos in '92, listed on Nasdaq in '94, and at that

1 time all we had was 1.7 million, which we raised from

2 friends and family, and started then with a small casino

3 in Colorado and grew from there.

4 Our Board of Directors has in addition to

5 Erwin and myself three independent outside directors.

6 Their backgrounds are in investment banking, accounting

7 and auditing, as well as IT.

8 After we started in Colorado in the early

9 '90s, we expanded our presence in Colorado with another

10 casino that we developed from the ground up in early

11 2000s, and then we started to develop and acquire

12 casinos in Canada, and today we do own and operate five

13 casinos, including two racetracks, in the province of

14 Alberta.

15 This is a slide about our investment

16 highlights. I want to highlight the last point her. We

17 are very proud of our conservative balance sheet.

18 After this transaction we will have an EBITDA

19 multiple of 2.3, which is considered by most gaming

20 analysts very healthy and one of the most conservative

21 balance sheets in North America.

22 And here is the transaction we are asking for

23 your approval for. Century plans to acquire three

24 casinos from Eldorado, for a total of 385 million.

25 Century Casinos will purchase the operations of those

1 three casinos, and VICI will purchase the real estate.

We are going to finance this transaction with a 180 million credit facility from Macquarie Capital. This will be the only debt on our balance sheet. It will take care of this acquisition and also our existing debt.

7 The transaction was signed in June of this year. We have received West Virginia Gaming approval 8 9 already, and your approval is the last one remaining; 10 and if we are fortunate to get approved today, we plan to close this transaction this Friday, December the 6th. 11 12 This is a very significant transaction for us, and it will transform Century Casinos into a 13 substantial regional gaming company in North America. 14 The company will have 18 properties, operating over 15 7,000 gaming machines, 285 gaming tables and over 16 400 hotel rooms. 17 18 The two properties here in Missouri will generate 17 percent of our consolidated revenue and 19 almost one-third of our consolidated EBITDA, so it goes 20 21 without saying that they will get our fullest attention. 22 Earlier this summer we formed a transition project team. It has been hard at work and visited all 23 properties every few weeks, with the goal to secure a 24 25 seamless transition for all our customers and employees.

1	We are proud of having increased benefits for
2	the local employees. Employee handbooks have been
3	created and distributed, as well as training and
4	development programs.
5	We will transfer the loyalty program to what
6	we call our Winners' Zone Program. We have established
7	this in Colorado and in Canada already for quite some
8	time. It is very successful and we look forward to
9	introducing it here. Of course we will honor all of the
10	points and comps customers have currently earned, as
11	well as the TITO tickets.
12	Our plan is to work with existing management
13	teams and personnel, and we are happy to report that we
14	have retained all directors and managers at both
15	properties. Lyle and Denny are here with us today, and
16	we work closely with them to prepare for the transition
17	and have prepared and distributed all materials to them
18	in the last few weeks.
19	We are also committed to continue the focus
20	of the two casinos on providing equal employment
21	opportunities to current members and future applicants.
22	Our Affirmative Action Policy and Equal Opportunity
23	Policy has been provided to the Commission already. In
24	April or about April we will rebrand two properties
25	to Century Casinos.

1	We have met with and we continue to meet with
2	local community members to understand their challenges
3	and their needs, and we fully stand behind the
4	property's minority and women- owned businesses as
5	suppliers as preferred suppliers in the local region.
6	And finally we would like to assure you that
7	we have placed a very high priority on keeping all our
8	properties well maintained, fresh and exciting for all
9	our employees and customers.
10	In addition, we are analyzing the slot floor,
11	and we are preparing a program to purchase new slot
12	machines at both properties in Missouri. We're working
13	to ensure that our rewards system is ready to offer free
14	play if it is approved by the Commission, and we are
15	constantly evaluating both properties together with
16	local management to determine the best areas for future
17	growth.
18	We would like to thank the Commission for
19	working with us through the licensing process, and we
20	look forward to continuing the success of both
21	properties here in Missouri.
22	Thank you.
23	CHAIRMAN LEARA: Any discussion or questions
24	for Mr. Hoetzinger?
25	Mr. Jamison.

- 23 assets are going to good hands and a company that
- 24 they'll get the kind of attention that they would be
- 25 unlikely to get in a company as large as we are

1 becoming.

2	It's a bittersweet day for us. We lose Denny
3	and Lyle as leaders, as managers here. They're doing a
4	fantastic job up through and to closing, and we'd expect
5	a smooth transition.
6	So we just wanted to make those comments in
7	front of you this morning.

 15 16 17 18 19 20 21 22 23 	MS. GALLAGHER: Good morning, Chairman Leara, Commissioners, Executive Director and staff. My name is Samantha Gallagher, and I'm the Executive Vice President and General Counsel of VICI Properties. We're here today to present to you in connection with the application for licensure of Century Casinos in connection with its acquisition of the Isle Casino Cape Girardeau and Lady Luck Casino Cape

estate relating to these assets simultaneously with
 Century Casinos' acquisition of the operations of such
 assets. We will finance the acquisition with cash on
 hand.

5 While we're not new to the State of Missouri,
6 having been licensed here since 2017, I did want to take
7 this opportunity to briefly provide a background on
8 VICI, which is a publicly traded Real Estate Investment
9 Trust.

10 As an experiential REIT, we aim to be the

11 real estate partner of choice for leading leisure and

12 hospitality operators and to lease our properties to

13 tenants that maintain market leading relationships with

14 their consumers.

15 VICI has been highly acquisitive since our

16 formation in October 2017. As shown on these upcoming

17 slides, we currently own 24 assets, including Harrah's

18 North Kansas City, and have eight assets currently under

19 contract for acquisition, including these two that we're

20 discussing today.

This next slide provides further detail
regarding the specifics of our acquisitions since our
formation, including both our closed, as well as our

25 Iormation, including both our closed, as well as c

24 pending transactions.

25 A common thread with all of these properties

1 is that VICI is the passive owner of the real estate and all operations are under the control of the applicable 2 tenant and casino licensee. Our role with Century and 3 the Isle Casino Cape Girardeau and Lady Luck Casino 4 5 Caruthersville will be the same. 6 VICI has a proven and independent management team with expertise in real estate, gaming and 7 hospitality, and an independent and experienced board of 8 directors, one of whom, Eric Hausier, lives here in 9 Missouri. 10 11 Since our initial public offering in February 2018 we've conducted two additional highly successful 12 follow-on equity offers and have found the market very 13 receptive to our capital raising efforts. 14 15 In particular, our most recent equity 16 offering in June 2019 was the largest primary REIT follow-on offering ever. Our ability to access the 17 capital markets contribute to our financial stability by 18 19 ensuring that we have the ability to raise capital to consummate the acquisitions in our pipeline. 20 21 Turning the Commission's attention to the 22 transaction under review today. VICI looks forward to 23 expanding our investment in the state of Missouri, having been licensed in Missouri since 2017. The 24

25 acquisition of the land and real estate of Isle Casino

1 Cape Girardeau and Lady Luck Casino Caruthersville will result in our investment in three diverse properties in 2 the state of Missouri on both the east and west sides of 3 4 the state. 5 The next two slides give an overview of the proposed transaction and the lease terms, which Peter 6 7 has done an excellent job of describing, and have been previously discussed with the Commission and its staff. 8 9 With that I'd be pleased to answer any questions that you may have with respect to either the 10 11 proposed transaction with Century or VICI in general, 12 and I thank you for your time today. 13 CHAIRMAN LEARA: Questions of Ms. Gallagher? 14 COMMISSIONER JAMISON: Yes, I do. 15 CHAIRMAN LEARA: Mr. Jamison. 16 COMMISSIONER JAMISON: So if this goes 17 through, then VICI will have -- you'll continue to do 18 Harrah's North Kansas City? 19 MS. GALLAGHER: That's correct. 20 COMMISSIONER JAMISON: Even if that has a

- 21 change of control?
- 22 MS. GALLAGHER: That's correct.
- 23 COMMISSIONER JAMISON: And then you'll have
- 24 these two, which will give you a total of three in the
- 25 state of Missouri?

1	MS.	GALLA	GHER:	That's	correct.

- 2 COMMISSIONER JAMISON: Okay. Thank you.
- 3 COMMISSIONER BOULWARE: Out of curiosity, is
- 4 this normal for the casino property to be owned by a
- 5 different entity than the entity that operates the
- 6 casino?

7	MS. GALLAGHER: Yes. And we have all of
8	our assets are that way, and we've done that with
9	several other gaming operators, Caesars, Eldorado, Penn
10	National Gaming, Hard Rock and now Century.
11	COMMISSIONER BOULWARE: Why is that?
12	MS. GALLAGHER: Why is it done that way?
13	COMMISSIONER BOULWARE: Right.
14	MS. GALLAGHER: We think we can be helpful in
15	providing a source of capital to our gaming operators,
16	where it's not necessary for them to own the real estate
17	and we're able to own the real estate and provide them
18	the capital with the total purchase price. We're
19	funding a significant amount of the purchase price, and
20	so we're able to help our operating partner fund the
21	transaction and serves as growth capital.
22	COMMISSIONER JAMISON: Brandon, I would say
23	that this is the new normal. This is the new normal in
24	the last, what, four and a half, five years max. Before
25	that all of the capital was held within the operating

1	casinos, and then in the last four years there's been a				
2	big move to move that capital out and we leave that off				
3	their balance sheet.				
4	Is that				
5	MS. GALLAGHER: You're exactly right. That's				
6	true.				
7	COMMISSIONER JAMISON: So it's a new normal.				
8	MS. GALLAGHER: A new normal. Normal since				
9	our formation. But, yes, you're right. Absolutely				
10	true.				
11	CHAIRMAN LEARA: Any other questions?				
12	COMMISSIONER CONWAY: Chairman.				
13	CHAIRMAN LEARA: Mr. Conway.				
14	COMMISSIONER CONWAY: Thank you, Mr. Chair.				
15	Just a question in regard to that				
16	relationship.				
17	MS. GALLAGHER: Uh-huh.				
18	COMMISSIONER CONWAY: You own the property.				
19	Correct?				
20	MS. GALLAGHER: Correct.				
21	COMMISSIONER CONWAY: Who is responsible or				
22	who makes the decision on the improvements to that				
23	property, the casino management or the owners of the				
24	property?				
25	MS. GALLAGHER: Our tenants makes those				

1 decisions, and they have obligations with respect to

2 capital expenditures of the property.

3 COMMISSIONER CONWAY: So there's a certain 4 established relationship with the two that decides that 5 a certain amount of money will be funded each year to --6 MS. GALLAGHER: That's correct. 7 COMMISSIONER CONWAY: -- make those 8 improvements to ensure that the casino --9 MS. GALLAGHER: -- is maintained. That's 10 correct. And the lease provides for that. 11 COMMISSIONER CONWAY: Is that a common 12 practice for most of the industry or --13 MS. GALLAGHER: We believe it to be a common 14 practice, and it is a common practice through all of our leases. 15 16 COMMISSIONER CONWAY: Okay. Thank you. 17 Thank you, Mr. Chair. 18 CHAIRMAN LEARA: Further discussion? 19 I have a couple questions. 20 You mentioned that you're a publicly traded 21 company. I think your parent is publicly traded, VICI? 22 MS. GALLAGHER: VICI is a publicly traded 23 company. 24 CHAIRMAN LEARA: Because I see Century is up 25 there.

- 1 MS. GALLAGHER: VICI.
- 2 CHAIRMAN LEARA: It is VICI.
- 3 And what's the overall size of VICI's
- 4 portfolio?
- 5 MS. GALLAGHER: Our total number of assets or
- 6 market cap?
- 7 CHAIRMAN LEARA: No, not the market cap. The
- 8 value of the assets.
- 9 MS. GALLAGHER: Well, we're -- so our total,
- 10 we have 24 current assets that we own in our total
- 11 capitalization, roughly 11 1/2 billion.
- 12 CHAIRMAN LEARA: When you say market cap, it
- 13 means the value of the stock trade, but the property
- 14 value of 24 assets is roughly --
- 15 MS. GALLAGHER: Roughly that, 10 billion.
- 16 CHAIRMAN LEARA: Okay.
- 17 No other discussion?
- 18 Thank you.
- 19 CHAIRMAN LEARA: All right. We'll take time
- 20 for public comments on this transaction.
- 21 Does anyone wish to speak in favor or in
- 22 opposition of this?
- 23 Seeing none, we will now hear the
- 24 investigative summary and staff recommendation on this
- 25 transaction.

1	EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR GROTHAUS: That will be
2	provided by our investigations manager, David Leitman.
3	CHAIRMAN LEARA: Mr. Leitman, you have the
4	floor.
5	MR. LEITMAN: Good morning, Chairman,
6	Commissioners.
7	The Missouri Gaming Commission background
8	staff conducted suitability investigations on six
9	interrelated companies, one Class A applicant, Century
10	Casinos, Inc., and five business entities, Century ACQ,
11	Inc., Flyfish Management & Consulting AG, Focus
12	Lifestyle & Entertainment AG, Caruthersville TC 1
13	Corporation and Cape Girardeau TC 2 Corporation.
14	These investigations included, but were not
15	limited to, inquiries with national and international
16	law enforcement, jurisdictional and other governmental
17	agencies, a review of regulatory disciplinary actions
18	and litigation.
19	The financial analysis was based on
20	examination of Century's SEC filings and financial
21	statements, as well as additional information from the
22	company and discussion with company staff.
23	A detailed, comprehensive report was created
24	that outlines the summary of the transaction, the
25	mechanics for how it will be accomplished and the fiscal

1 impacts of the proposed acquisition.

2	In addition, suitability investigations were				
3	conducted on seven persons associated with the				
4	companies. The results of those investigations were				
5	provided to the MGC staff for their review. The				
6	investigatory staff are present to answer any questions				
7	you may have, as well as the company representatives,				
8	which pretty much covered it I think, but that's up to				
9	you.				
10	Staff recommends approval and I thank you.				
11	CHAIRMAN LEARA: Questions for Mr. Leitman?				
12	COMMISSIONER JAMISON: No, sir.				
13	CHAIRMAN LEARA: I have a quick one.				
14	MR. LEITMAN: Yes, sir.				
15	CHAIRMAN LEARA: When you do these				
16	investigations, you did it on the key licenses, the				
17	companies and then also on the individuals?				
18	MR. LEITMAN: Correct.				
19	CHAIRMAN LEARA: And that was both				
20	regulatory, including criminal and financial?				
21	MR. LEITMAN: Correct. The agencies or the				
22	regulatory authorities or jurisdictions, however you				
23	want to refer to it as, where they're currently licensed				
24	were contacted for any disciplinary issues in their				
25	application for licensure in those venues.				

1	CHAIRMAN LEARA: Thank you, Mr. Leitman.
2	Any discussion on the presentation?
3	Seeing none, we'll move for the adoption of
4	Resolution No. 19-048, the Class A licensure.
5	COMMISSIONER JAMISON: I move for adoption.
6	CHAIRMAN LEARA: We have a motion. Do we
7	have a second?
8	COMMISSIONER CONWAY: Second.
9	CHAIRMAN LEARA: A second by Mr. Conway.
10	Any other discussion?
11	Seeing none, Angie, please call the roll.
12	MS. FRANKS: Commissioner Conway.
13	COMMISSIONER CONWAY: Approved.
14	MS. FRANKS: Commissioner Boulware.
15	COMMISSIONER BOULWARE: Approved.
16	MS. FRANKS: Commissioner Finney.
17	COMMISSIONER FINNEY: Approved.
18	MS. FRANKS: Commissioner Jamison.
19	COMMISSIONER JAMISON: Approved.
20	MS. FRANKS: Chairman Leara.
21	CHAIRMAN LEARA: Approved.
22	MS. FRANKS: By your vote you've adopted
23	Resolution No. 19-048.
24	CHAIRMAN LEARA: Next for consideration is
25	Resolution No. 19-049 for the change of control.

- 1 Any discussion?
- 2 Seeing none, do we have a motion to approve?
- 3 COMMISSIONER CONWAY: So moved.
- 4 CHAIRMAN LEARA: We have a motion. Do we
- 5 have a second?
- 6 COMMISSIONER FINNEY: Second.
- 7 CHAIRMAN LEARA: We have a second.
- 8 Please call the roll.
- 9 MS. FRANKS: Commissioner Conway.
- 10 COMMISSIONER CONWAY: Approved.
- 11 MS. FRANKS: Commissioner Boulware.
- 12 COMMISSIONER BOULWARE: Approved.
- 13 MS. FRANKS: Commissioner Finney.
- 14 COMMISSIONER FINNEY: Approved.
- 15 MS. FRANKS: Commissioner Jamison.
- 16 COMMISSIONER JAMISON: Approved.
- 17 MS. FRANKS: Chairman Leara.
- 18 CHAIRMAN LEARA: Approved.
- 19 MS. FRANKS: By your vote you've adopted
- 20 Resolution No. 19-049.
- 21 CHAIRMAN LEARA: The next item is Resolution
- 22 No. 19-050, the key business entity license.
- 23 Any discussion?
- 24 Seeing none, I'll entertain a motion for
- 25 approval.

- 1 COMMISSIONER BOULWARE: So moved.
- 2 CHAIRMAN LEARA: We have a motion. Do we
- 3 have a second?
- 4 COMMISSIONER CONWAY: Second.
- 5 CHAIRMAN LEARA: We have a second.
- 6 Angie, please call the roll.
- 7 MS. FRANKS: Commissioner Conway.
- 8 COMMISSIONER CONWAY: Approved.
- 9 MS. FRANKS: Commissioner Boulware.
- 10 COMMISSIONER BOULWARE: Approved.
- 11 MS. FRANKS: Commissioner Finney.
- 12 COMMISSIONER FINNEY: Approved.
- 13 MS. FRANKS: Commissioner Jamison.
- 14 COMMISSIONER JAMISON: Approved.
- 15 MS. FRANKS: Chairman Leara.
- 16 CHAIRMAN LEARA: Approved.
- 17 MS. FRANKS: By your vote you've adopted
- 18 Resolution No. 19-050.
- 19 CHAIRMAN LEARA: Those items were for change
- 20 of control for Century Casinos.
- 21 The next item on the agenda is change of
- 22 control for Eldorado Resorts.
- 23 Please state your name and you have the
- 24 floor.
- 25 MR. REEG: Good morning again.

1	I'm Tom Reeg, CEO of Eldorado. I've got with
2	me Jeff Hendricks, Vice President, Regulatory and
3	Compliance for Eldorado, and Tim Lambert, regulatory
4	counsel for Caesars.
5	We are excited to be in front of you today to
6	present our proposed merger with Caesars Entertainment.
7	In contrast to the Century transaction, you are the
8	first jurisdiction that we're in front of for approval
9	in this transaction.
10	If you would move to Slide 4.
11	The proposed transaction is we acquire all of
12	the outstanding shares of Caesars for 8.40 a share in
13	cash and .0899 shares of Eldorado common stock for each
14	share of Caesars stock. That's about 76 million shares
15	to Caesars' shareholders. So that the pro forma
16	ownership is 51 percent Eldorado shareholders,
17	49 percent Caesars. We have committed financing in
18	place to fund the transaction.
19	The Eldorado leadership team will remain in
20	place, so I'll be the CEO of the combined entity. Gary
21	Carano will be Executive Chairman; Anthony Carano, Chief
22	Operating Officer; Bret Yunker, Chief Financial Officer;
23	and Ed Quatmann, Chief Legal Officer, all of which you
24	in Missouri are familiar with from our prior ownership
25	in the state.

1 The structure of the transaction is we form a merger sub. We enter into an agreement and plan of 2 merger between that sub, Colt, and Caesars, and 3 4 effectively Caesars changes off of the holding company down through the Harrah's North Kansas City, LLC box 5 that you're familiar with. 6 7 The only change within Caesars that's material is we'll collapse CEOC into CRC, and that 8 allows us to move cash freely within the Caesars 9 enterprise and up to the parent. So the licensees are 10 ourselves and then the existing Caesars licensees as you 11

12 have been familiar with.

13 The board will be an eleven-member board, six from the Eldorado side, five from the Caesars side. All 14 15 of the proposed directors from both sides were already licensed in Missouri at the time of the agreement except 16 17 for Jan Jones Blackhurst, who was the former mayor of 18 Las Vegas, who was an executive within Caesars. Ms. Blackhurst got her license -- her key person license 19 at the October Missouri meeting. We're excited to have 20 21 her onboard. 22 We will change our name to Caesars Entertainment. We'll trade under the Caesars' ticker 23

- 24 post closing. On November 15 shareholders of both
- 25 companies approved the transaction with a vote in excess

1 of 99 percent on both sides. We're in the process of regulatory approvals. We expect more in December. By 2 January and February we'll be busy. We have an intent 3 4 to close in the first half of 2020 as we sit here today. I'd expect we're towards the end of the first quarter of 5 2020 for closing. 6 7 As I said, we have fully committed financing. J.P. Morgan led but now with a full syndication of 8 banks. There's \$3.2 million coming from VICI. 9 Samantha, Ed, John and their team have been phenomenal 10

11 for us.

12 In terms of the earlier questions, this is a way to raise capital from an asset, where typically it 13 had been locked within these companies and kind of an 14 inefficient use of capital. We use capital from VICI, 15 enter into these lease agreements that we're inheriting 16 from the Caesars' side. We bring leases of our own from 17 18 GLPI. We'll end up about 50 percent owned, 50 percent leased in terms of our assets both from an amount of 19 assets and a percentage of the company from an EBITDA 20 21 standpoint. 22 Importantly we provide a corporate guarantee on all of our leases. So Harrah's North Kansas City is 23 subject to a master lease that comes in from the 24 25 Caesars' side, but that lease is guaranteed by the

corporate parent. So we look at it as the full faith
 and credit of the entire company stands behind that
 lease.

4 In addition to the funding from VICI, we've got 3.3 billion from cash on hand, asset sales and new 5 financing. The bulk of the existing Caesars financing 6 7 stays in place, except for we'll refinance the CEOC debt. We will not have a funded debt maturity until 8 9 December of 2024, so more than four years post closing. 10 We should be generating in the neighborhood of a billion and a half of free cash flow per year. 11 12 We'll have \$2 billion of available revolver capacity, a billion in the Caesars entity, a billion on the Eldorado 13 side, and we also have a put in 2022 on Indiana assets 14 15 to VICI that could provide an extra liquidity in the neighborhood of \$2 billion. 16 17 So we have structured this financing knowing 18 that the numbers are big but that we're set up to survive and thrive in any economic environment. We 19 20 recognize that we're late in the economic cycle today, 21 so we wanted to make sure we had plenty of runway to complete integration, drive free cash flow and pay down 22 debt quickly post transaction. 23 24 The specifics of the VICI lease and the eight

25 asset sales, the VICI master lease where Harrah's North

- 1 Kansas City sits will be amended to accommodate new
- 2 properties that I'll talk about below.

3	There's no additional Missouri licenses that
4	come in to any REIT agreement. VICI will acquire the
5	real estate surrounding or associated with Harrah's
6	Atlantic City, Harrah's Laughlin and Harrah's
7	New Orleans. That's a billion eight of the
8	\$3.2 billion that we're raising from VICI.
9	The lease and those will enter the lease
10	that North Kansas City is a part of. The leases from
11	Harrah's Las Vegas and Caesars Palace will be amended to
12	increase the lease payment in return for a billion four
13	of capital from VICI. That gets you to the 3.2 billion.
14	VICI has right of first refusal for whole
15	asset sale or sale-leaseback transactions on two
16	Las Vegas Strip asset sales we have set publicly, that
17	it's our intention to sell Las Vegas Strip asset post
18	closing, and they also have a right of first refusal on
19	Horseshoe Casino Baltimore, and we've discussed the
20	put/call for Indiana.
21	In terms of our asset sales, we have the sale
22	that you just approved to Century. We've got a sale
23	that's in process that includes Isle Kansas City to
24	Twin Rivers for \$230 million. They tell us that they
25	expect to close in the first half of 2020.

1	Importantly,	those	asset sale	es introc	luce two

2 new licensees to the state that have both been very good

- 3 to work with from our standpoint.
- 4 Post transaction we'll have approximately
- 5 60 properties, over 50,000 hotel rooms, about 4 million
- 6 square feet of casino space, lots of slots and tables
- 7 and food and beverage outlets.
- 8 You can see that we are well diversified
- 9 across the U.S. map. There's a modest amount of
- 10 international assets that come with Caesars, primarily
- 11 in the U.K., but we are almost exclusively a U.S.
- 12 domestic footprint post transaction.
- 13 And with that I'd like to thank you, the
- 14 Commission and its staff for your work here.
- 15 This one is obviously a complex case. The
- 16 State and your Commission, your staff worked through it
- 17 efficiently and quickly and we appreciate that.
- 18 CHAIRMAN LEARA: Questions for Mr. Reeg?
- 19 I have a quick one.
- 20 On your put option that you have on the
- 21 Indiana property, why do you have that? Is that kind of
- 22 a quasi line of credit or --
- 23 MR. REEG: So when we entered into the
- 24 agreement to buy Caesars and the real estate agreement
- 25 with VICI, VICI had existing pieces of its lease

1 agreement with Caesars that were important, which

2 included a right of first refusal on Centaur.

3	And so as part of the package of VICI
4	exercising its call options in New Jersey and Nevada and
5	Louisiana and getting the right of first refusals, they
6	asked that we consider allowing them to kind of re-let
7	the Centaur the ability to own Centaur, trade
8	through, and the structure that we came up with was a
9	put/call, where there's a set level where we can put
10	assets to Centaur and a level where they can call them
11	from us if we don't exercise our put.
12	So it creates capital for continued growth
13	and the leveraging for us. It provides a visible growth
14	pipeline for VICI. So it was a win-win for both of us.
15	CHAIRMAN LEARA: Very good.
16	Any other questions?
17	Seeing none, thank you, Mr. Reeg.
18	MR. REEG: Thank you.
19	CHAIRMAN LEAR: Does anyone wish to speak on
20	behalf of Eldorado? I see you have a team here.
21	MR. HENDRICKS: We're just here for
22	questions. We appreciate it.
23	CHAIRMAN LEARA: Mr. Reeg, thank you.
24	MR. REEG: Thank you.

25 CHAIRMAN LEARA: We'll open for public

- 1 comments on that.
- 2 If there is none, then we'll go right to the
- 3 investigation and staff recommendation.
- 4 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR GROTHAUS: That would be5 David Leitman.
- 6 CHAIRMAN LEARA: Mr. Leitman, when you're
- 7 ready.
- 8 MR. LEITMAN: All right. Mr. Chairman,
- 9 Commissioners.
- 10 The Missouri Gaming Commission background
- 11 staff conducted an investigation into the financial
- 12 soundness of Eldorado Resorts, Inc's acquisition of
- 13 Caesars Entertainment.
- 14 The staff were tasked with examining the
- 15 financial details associated with the transaction and
- 16 assessing the company's continued financial suitability.
- 17 The financial analysis was based on the
- 18 examination of Eldorado's SEC filings and financial
- 19 statements, as well as additional information from the
- 20 company and discussions with company staff.
- 21 A detailed, comprehensive report was created
- 22 that outlines the summary of the transaction, the
- 23 mechanics for how it will be accomplished and the fiscal
- 24 impacts of the proposed acquisition.
- 25 The results of the financial analysis were

1 provided to the Missouri Gaming Commission staff for

2 their review, and you have the related summary before

3 you.

- 4 Staff does recommend approval and I thank you
- 5 for your time.
- 6 CHAIRMAN LEARA: Questions for Mr. Leitman?
- 7 COMMISSIONER JAMISON: No, sir.
- 8 CHAIRMAN LEARA: Seeing none, thank you,
- 9 Mr. Leitman.
- 10 MR. LEITMAN: Thank you.
- 11 CHAIRMAN LEARA: We will now consider
- 12 Resolution No. 19-051, the acquisition of Caesars by
- 13 Eldorado.
- 14 Any discussion?
- 15 Seeing none, we'll entertain a motion for
- 16 approval.
- 17 COMMISSIONER BOULWARE: So moved.
- 18 CHAIRMAN LEARA: We have a motion. Do we
- 19 have a second?
- 20 COMMISSIONER FINNEY: Second.
- 21 CHAIRMAN LEARA: And a second.
- 22 No other discussion.
- 23 Angie, please call the roll.
- 24 MS. FRANKS: Commissioner Conway.
- 25 COMMISSIONER CONWAY: Approved.

- 1 MS. FRANKS: Commissioner Boulware.

- 8 CHAIRMAN LEARA: Approved.
- 9 MS. FRANKS: By your vote you've adopted
- 10 Resolution No. 19-051.
- 11 CHAIRMAN LEARA: Congratulations.
- 12 The next item on the agenda, Relicensure of
- 13 Certain Supplier.
- 14 We have a resolution. Is there someone to
- 15 present that?

16 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR GROTHAUS: Yes. That

- 17 would be Mr. Leitman again.
- 18 CHAIRMAN LEARA: Mr. Leitman, when you're
- 19 ready.
- 20 MR. LEITMAN: Mr. Chairman, Commissioners.
- 21 The Missouri Gaming Commission background
- 22 staff conducted the relicensing investigation of Everi
- 23 Holdings, Inc., a wholly owned subsidiary of Everi
- 24 Holdings, Inc., a publicly traded company.
- 25 The investigation consisted of jurisdictional

1	inquiries, feedback from affected gaming company
2	clients, a review of disciplinary actions, litigation,
3	financial statements, an evaluation of financial metrics
4	and business credit profiles, as well as a review of the
5	key persons associated with the company.
6	The results of this investigation was
7	provided to the MGC staff for their review and you
8	possess a summary report which outlines our
9	investigative findings.
10	Again, staff recommends approval. Thank you.
11	CHAIRMAN LEARA: Questions for Mr. Leitman?
12	Seeing none, could we have a motion for
13	Resolution 19-052 for approval?
14	COMMISSIONER CONWAY: So moved.
15	CHAIRMAN LEARA: We have a motion. A second,
16	please.
17	COMMISSIONER JAMISON: Second.
18	CHAIRMAN LEARA: And a second.
19	No other discussion.
20	Angie, please call the roll.
21	MS. FRANKS: Commissioner Conrad.
22	COMMISSIONER CONRAD: Approved.
23	MS. FRANKS: Commissioner Boulware.
24	COMMISSIONER BOULWARE: Approved.
25	MS. FRANKS: Commissioner Finney.

- 8 CHAIRMAN LEARA: The next item, Licensure for
- 9 Level I/Key Applicants, Resolution No. 19-053.
- 10 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR GROTHAUS: And,
- 11 Mr. Chairman, that will be Mr. Leitman again.
- 12 CHAIRMAN LEARA: Mr. Leitman, I think you can
- 13 just stay right at the podium.
- 14 MR. LEITMAN: Should I move a chair up here?
- 15 CHAIRMAN LEARA: When you're ready.
- 16 MR. LEITMAN: Mr. Chairman and Commissioners,
- 17 the Missouri Gaming Commission background staff
- 18 conducted comprehensive background investigations on
- 19 multiple key and Level I applicants for licensure.
- 20 The investigations consisted of financial
- 21 review and analysis, including examination of their bank
- 22 and security accounts, net worth and tax returns.
- 23 General character inquiries were made in the
- 24 jurisdictions where the applicants lived, worked, and
- 25 criminal history checks to determine their suitability

1 were conducted.

2 The following individuals it's quite a
3 laundry list. There are about 14 of them are
4 presented for your consideration: Darin L. Roth,

- 3 Staff recommends approval of these
- 4 14 individuals. Thank you.
- 5 CHAIRMAN LEARA: Questions for Mr. Leitman?
- 6 COMMISSIONER JAMISON: No, sir.
- 7 CHAIRMAN LEARA: I have a couple.
- 8 MR. LEITMAN: Go ahead.
- 9 Well, let me throw a disclaimer. The
- 10 investigative staff is here in the room. I did not
- 11 conduct all these investigations, so I may defer your
- 12 questions.
- 13 CHAIRMAN LEARA: It's not really specific
- 14 individuals. It's just in general, so hopefully you can
- 15 answer that.
- 16 MR. LEITMAN: All right.
- 17 CHAIRMAN LEARA: So you have several foreign
- 18 nationals?
- 19 MR. LEITMAN: We do.
- 20 CHAIRMAN LEARA: And you do investigations on
- 21 that, and it seemed that they are not as lengthy. There
- 22 is some consolidation in your report when they're
- 23 foreign nationals. Can you explain that a little bit
- 24 here?
- 25 MR. LEITMAN: We are very limited in a lot of

1 the information we can receive from foreign countries. In fact, for an employment-type background we are 2 prohibited by laws in local countries from inquiring. 3 Firsthand information from prior investigations. Going to Italy to conduct a background 5 on a company years ago, we were prohibited from talking 6 7 to government officials. We could be arrested. With that investigation we had to physically go there, and we 8 were warned by the State department and several other 9 authorities, don't ask. You'll end up in jail. So 10 they're kind of serious. So that's why it's 11 abbreviated. 12 13 Now, to that end, we send letters out where we know it's possible and sometimes we get responses. 14 Sometimes we don't. 15 16 One of the individuals had affiliations in South Africa. Sent an inquiry through their gaming 17 18 authority. We got it back in about ten days. Pretty unusual. But they responded to us. So sometimes it 19 works and sometimes it doesn't. 20 21 CHAIRMAN LEARA: And then on the financial aspect of the investigation I've noticed that there --22 you know, there's no -- I don't know. Maybe that's not 23 correct. But could you explain how that is done when 24 there's a signed statement as we've complied with all 25

1 our nation's tax laws?

2	MR. LEITMAN: I cannot. Maggie White.
3	MS. WHITE: What's the question again?
4	CHAIRMAN LEARA: Other than just the
5	statement that our taxes are paid, is there a more
6	indepth financial analysis than that?
7	MS. WHITE: Well, we do receive I think it
8	was mentioned in the report like a tax affidavit
9	stating that they have complied with all of the tax
10	laws, just as we might receive from the IRS saying that.
11	So we did similar to what we received from the IRS.
12	CHAIRMAN LEARA: But other than the tax
13	statements you do a full financial analysis on those
14	individuals also?
15	MS. WHITE: Yes, we do the same level of
16	investigation for them as well.
17	CHAIRMAN LEARA: Very good. Thank you.
18	MR. LEITMAN: Thank you.
19	Any other questions for Mr. Leitman?
20	All right. So we have Resolution 19-053,
21	licensure of these individuals. I'll entertain a motion

1	statements, income tax returns, application reviews and
2	verification of statutory compliance for the following
3	fantasy sports contest operator which has applied for
4	licensure: Yahoo Fantasy Sports, LLC. The results of
5	this review, analysis and statutory verification are
6	provided in the summary report.
7	Staff recommends approval. Thank you.
8	CHAIRMAN LEARA: Questions for Mr. Leitman?
9	COMMISSIONER JAMISON: Did Yahoo have a
10	license prior to that in Missouri?
11	MR. LEITMAN: Not to my knowledge, no.
12	COMMISSIONER JAMISON: So this is the first

- 19 staff conducted investigations on the Carta Mundi Group
- 20 Companies as they seek licensure to purchase Bicycle
- 21 Holdings, Inc. and its subsidiaries to include the
- 22 United States Playing Card Company, who is a licensed
- 23 supplier in the state of Missouri.
- 24 The Carta Mundi Group includes the following
- 25 companies: Carta Mundi, Inc., Cartamundi NV, Brepols

- 1 Group NV and Van Genechten NV, who have all applied for
- 2 key business entity licenses.
- 3 Brepols Group is primarily owned by the 4 De Somer family and Van Genechten is primarily owned by the De Cartier family. Cartamundi NV was established in 5 1970 as a joint venture between the two groups of 6 7 companies. Each company has a 50 percent ownership interest in Cartamundi NV; therefore, neither having a 8 controlling interest. 9 10 The investigations included, but were not limited to, inquiries with national and international 11 12 law enforcement, jurisdictional and other governmental agencies, a review of regulatory disciplinary actions 13 and litigation, a financial review and analysis, 14 15 including examination of financial statements and income 16 tax returns. The results of these investigations were 17 18 provided to the MGC staff for their review and subsequently provided to you. 19 20 The staff does recommend approval. Thank 21 you. 22 CHAIRMAN LEARA: Questions for Mr. Leitman? 23 COMMISSIONER JAMISON: No. 24 CHAIRMAN LEARA: Seeing none, do we have a

- 25 Commissioners. My name is Barbara Whittle. I'm the

1 Charitable Games Manager here at the Missouri Gaming

2 Commission.

3	Today I am presenting five companies for the
4	relicensure as a supplier or manufacturer of bingo
5	products in the state of Missouri. All bingo supplier
6	and manufacturer licenses are issued for the calendar
7	year and expire on December 31st of each year.
8	The relicensure of both manufacturers and
9	suppliers includes, but is not limited to, a review of
10	Federal and State tax checks, a review of customer and
11	product lists, corporate organization checks and checks
12	for pending litigation for each company.
13	The following four companies have applied for
14	renewal of their manufacturer's license: Arrow
15	International, Incorporated, Fortunite, Incorporated,
16	Pollard Games, Incorporated doing business as American
17	Games and VKGS, LLC.
18	The following company has applied for renewal
19	of its supplier license: All-American Bingo,
20	Incorporated.
21	Manufacturer relicensures are presented in
22	Resolution 19-001-B. The supplier relicensure is
23	presented in Resolution 19-002-B. Staff recommends
24	approval of both resolutions. I would be happy to
25	answer any questions. Thank you.

3	Under Tab K we have a resolution which
4	authorizes the Chairman to extend any license for a
5	period of up to 60 days. This delegation is done
6	pursuant to our Rule 1.020(4).
7	Under that rule if the Chairman exercises
8	this authority, it has to be ratified by the full
9	Commission at its next regular meeting. The rule also
10	provides that the delegation expires in one year;
11	therefore, we place this resolution on every December
12	Commission meeting agenda.
13	CHAIRMAN LEARA: Questions for Mr. Grewach?
14	Seeing none, do we have a motion to approve?
15	COMMISSIONER BOULWARE: So moved.
16	CHAIRMAN LEARA: We have a motion. And a
17	second, please.
18	COMMISSIONER FINNEY: Second.

- 6 MS. FRANKS: By your vote you've adopted
- 7 Resolution No. 19-056.
- 8 CHAIRMAN LEARA: The next item for
- 9 consideration is Placement on List of Excluded Persons.
- 10 I assume Mr. Grewach will discuss that?
- 11 MR. GREWACH: Yes, Mr. Chairman.
- 12 CHAIRMAN LEARA: When you're ready.
- 13 MR. GREWACH: Under Tab L we have a
- 14 resolution to place Tony Richards on the involuntary
- 15 exclusion list.
- 16 This arises out of the same facts that you
- 17 heard at the last meeting involving a dealer at Mark
- 18 Twain Casino named Jordan Fussell.
- 19 There are two grounds that apply here that
- 20 would qualify a person to be placed on the involuntary
- 21 exclusion list.
- 22 The first is if a person violates any term of
- 23 Chapter 313 of the Missouri Statutes. The second is if
- 24 a person performs any act which adversely affects public
- 25 confidence and trust in gaming.

1	Mr. Richards was a pit manager at Mark Twain
2	Casino. In his position he supervised both the floor
3	supervisors and the dealers themselves. His job duties
4	included resolving patron complaints concerning the
5	outcome of table games.
6	On August the 1st of 2017 the Commission was
7	notified by casino surveillance of cheating at table
8	games on the casino floor.
9	The investigation determined that
10	Mr. Richards allowed patrons to place additional wagers
11	on hands after the hand was shown and known to be a
12	winning hand.
13	Mr. Richards went on to plead guilty to a
14	violation of Section 313.830, Revised Statutes of
15	Missouri, which is the Class E felony of cheating at a
16	gambling game. The court gave him a suspended
17	imposition of sentence, placed him on a five-year term
18	of supervised probation and prohibited him from entering
19	Mark Twain Casino. The Commission also revoked
20	Mr. Richards' gaming license in August of 2018.
21	CHAIRMAN LEARA: Questions?
22	Seeing none I would entertain a motion to
23	adopt Resolution No. 19-057.
24	COMMISSIONER JAMISON: So moved.
25	CHAIRMAN LEARA: A motion. Do we have a

1 second?

2	COMMISSIONER FINNEY: Second.
3	CHAIRMAN LEARA: And a second.
4	No further discussion.
5	Angie, please call the roll.
6	MS. FRANKS: Commissioner Conway.
7	COMMISSIONER CONWAY: Approved.
8	MS. FRANKS: Commissioner Boulware.
9	COMMISSIONER BOULWARE: Approved.
10	MS. FRANKS: Commissioner Finney.
11	COMMISSIONER FINNEY: Approved.
12	MS. FRANKS: Commissioner Jamison.
13	COMMISSIONER JAMISON: Approved.
14	MS. FRANKS: Chairman Leara.
15	CHAIRMAN LEARA: Approved.
16	MS. FRANKS: By your vote you've adopted
17	Resolution No. 19-057.
18	CHAIRMAN LEARA: Placement for the second
19	one, Mr. Grewach, when you're ready.
20	MR. GREWACH: Yes.
21	Under Tab L we have a resolution to place
22	Zachary Wolter on the involuntary exclusion list. The
23	facts of this case arise out of the same investigation
24	that I described in the previous tab for Mr. Richards.
25	Mr. Wolter was a roulette and craps dealer at

1	Mark Twain Casino, and the investigation determined that
2	he allowed players to place wagers at the roulette table
3	after it was known that there would be a winning spin.
4	While working as a craps dealer he called no rolls on
5	losing rolls and also called out different numbers on
6	the dice to make the losing roll win to a winning roll.
7	Mr. Wolter pled guilty in January of 2018 to
8	the Class E felony of cheating at a gambling game in
9	violation of Missouri Statute 313.830, received a
10	suspended imposition of sentence and five years of
11	supervised probation. He was also prohibited from
12	entering Mark Twain Casino, and the Commission revoked
13	his gaming license also in August of 2018.
14	CHAIRMAN LEARA: Questions?
15	COMMISSIONER JAMISON: No, sir.
16	COMMISSIONER CONWAY: Yeah, I guess I do have
17	a question. Thank you, Mr. Chairman.
18	Was there anyone else who might have been
19	involved at the same time who was working?
20	MR. GREWACH: Yes. There were three
21	employees, Jordan Fussell and Zachary Wolter as dealers
22	and Mr. Richards as the pit supervisor. All three of
23	their licenses were revoked.
24	Because it seemed to be a systemic failure of
25	the safeguards that needed to be in place to prevent

1	this from happening, the casino was also fined \$50,000
2	arising out of the same disciplinary action. But those
3	are the three individuals our investigation identified
4	as being involved in this activity.
5	COMMISSIONER CONRAD: So the three would be
6	working together at the same time, like on the craps
7	table where they were?
8	MR. GREWACH: Not necessarily. The craps
9	table does involve more than one casino personnel to
10	operate at times but roulette and some of the other card
11	tables do not. So they weren't necessarily all working
12	at the same time but they were their shifts did
13	overlap. Their activity did overlap.
14	COMMISSIONER CONWAY: Okay. Thank you.
15	CHAIRMAN LEARA: I'll entertain a motion to
16	approve Resolution 19-058.
17	COMMISSIONER BOULWARE: So moved.
18	CHAIRMAN LEARA: I have a motion. Do we have
19	a second?
20	COMMISSIONER FINNEY: Second.
21	CHAIRMAN LEARA: Any discussion?
22	Angie, please call the roll.
23	MS. FRANKS: Commissioner Conway.
24	COMMISSIONER CONWAY: Approved.
25	MS. FRANKS: Commissioner Boulware.

- 1 COMMISSIONER BOULWARE: Approved.
- 2 MS. FRANKS: Commissioner Finney.
- 3 COMMISSIONER FINNEY: Approved.

- 10 CHAIRMAN LEARA: The next item on the agenda
- 11 is Consideration of Rules and Regulations, Proposed
- 12 Amendments.
- 13 Mr. Grewach.
- 14 MR. GREWACH: Thank you.
- 15 These are four proposed rule amendments.
- 16 These four rules were previously approved by you at your
- 17 September 25th, 2019 meeting; however, due to a failure
- 18 to meet a deadline for filing these final orders of
- 19 rulemaking with the Secretary of State, we are
- 20 reproposing these as proposed rules.
- 21 The statute that governs the rulemaking
- 22 process sets up some very strict time limits on filings.
- 23 After you approve a proposed order, there's a public
- 24 hearing. There's a 90-day period after the public
- 25 hearing for a deadline to file the final orders of

1 rulemaking with the Secretary of State.

2	Once the Commission is presented, it approves
3	the final orders of rulemaking. The final orders then
4	have to be submitted to the Joint Committee on
5	Administrative Rules, JCAR, and they have 30 days to
6	review that.
7	So from the time you start out and you
8	approve a proposed order, there's a public hearing.
9	Then the comments come to you as a final order. Now
10	there's 30 days that we cannot file with the Secretary
11	of State.
12	So the bottom line is those two time periods,
13	the original 90 and this 30 where we can't file, in this
14	particular case, for example, set up four days in which
15	we had to file with the Secretary of State.
16	The first two days were a Saturday and
17	Sunday. The next two are Monday and Tuesday, and we
18	just missed that deadline.
19	COMMISSIONER JAMISON: So we went through all
20	of the processes and we were to the final step?
21	MR. GREWACH: We were.
22	CHAIRMAN LEARA: Okay.
23	MR. GREWACH: Yeah. I have to say that our
24	policy group does an excellent job managing this very
25	complex timetable that they have to deal with, and I

1 want to also say that this is the first time in a

2 25-year history that this has happened.

3	In addition to that, we've taken some
4	remedial steps. There were reminders that were to go
5	out to certain people of the filing deadlines. We've
6	expanded the number of people who get that notice, and
7	we've also included the legal section, including myself
8	and the persons that get that notice, to try to prevent
9	this type of event from happening again.
10	Going to the rules themselves, Items Nos. 1
11	and 2 deal with the process that casinos have to go
12	through to claim a credit for an overpayment of the
13	gaming tax.
14	Now, gaming tax returns are filed on a daily
15	basis. The existing rule required a certain claim form
16	to be filed in duplicate for any credit that was
17	requested outside of the game week regardless of the
18	amount of the credit.
19	When we looked at this, about 75 percent of
20	the credit form claims that were mailed were amounts
21	under \$100. As a matter of fact, we found one that was
22	at low as ten cents. So the amendment to 11.020
23	eliminates the requirement for the filing of the form
24	for any overpayment under \$100.
25	The amendment to 11.110 eliminates the

requirement that the form be filed in duplicates. Both
 of these amounts were part of our ongoing effort to
 review our rules to identify rules that are unnecessary
 or overly burdensome or create unnecessary paperwork
 as this did pursuant to the Governor's Executive
 Order 17-03.

7 Items 3 and 4 relate to bingo. The original constitutional amendment that authorized bingo required 8 a person to be a member of an organization for two years 9 10 prior to working a bingo event. In the November 2018 election the voters approved a constitutional amendment 11 12 reducing that time period to six months. 13 And these amendments are to make our rules consistent with that constitutional amendment and also a 14 15 statutory change that corresponded with that change. 16 If you approve these proposed amendments, they'll be a public comment period beginning on 17 18 January 15 of 2020. There will be a public hearing on March the 3rd of 2020. The final orders of 19 20 rulemaking, along with any comments or any proposed 21 changes in response to those comments, would be presented to you at your April meeting. And if 22 approved, at that time the rules would become effective 23 on August 30th of 2020. 24 25 CHAIRMAN LEARA: Any questions?

14	Angie, please call the roll.
