COMMISSION RESOLUTION NO. 19-043 REGARDING EXCLUSION OF DAVID J. BREWER FROM EXCURSION GAMBLING BOATS AND FACILITIES IN MISSOURI

WHEREAS, pursuant to 11 CSR 45-15.030, the Missouri Gaming Commission (the "Commission") has the authority to place a person on the Exclusion List for the conviction of a felony in any jurisdiction of any crime involving moral turpitude or of a crime involving gaming, violating any provision of Chapter 313 RSMo or any rule promulgated by the Missouri Gaming Commission, or performing any act or having a notorious or unsavory reputation which would adversely affect public confidence and trust in gaming, or has his name on any valid and current exclusion list from another jurisdiction in the United States; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to 11 CSR 45-15.010, placement on the Exclusion List prohibits such person from entering or having contact of any kind with any Missouri riverboat gaming operation; and

WHEREAS, on March 17, 2016, David J. Brewer pled guilty to one count of the Unlawful Financial Exploitation of an Elderly Person, a Class 1 felony, in the Circuit Court of Randolph County, Illinois. On April 11, 2016, the Court sentenced Mr. Brewer to five years in the Department of Corrections and ordered him to pay restitution in the amount of \$294,900.

On September 16, 2014, Mr. Brewer admitted obtaining control by deception over property owned by an elderly male victim during his employment as a licensed Insurance Producer in the State of Illinois.

Mr. Brewer has an extensive gambling history. Most notably, his lifetime wagers at Lumière Place Casino and Hotels totaled \$2,721,367 between 2010 and 2016, and at Ameristar Casino, St. Charles, Mr. Brewer had lifetime wagers of \$540,320.08 between 2010 and 2015. On September 17, 2015, Mr. Brewer was evicted from Ameristar Casino, St. Charles, and all Pinnacle-owned properties.¹

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Commission hereby finds that David J. Brewer is eligible for permanent placement on the Exclusion List, and the Commission directs the Executive Director to issue a Notice of Exclusion to David J. Brewer.
