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## Message from Chairman Jan Zimmerman



On November 5, 2024, gambling in the State of Missouri was permanently changed by voter approval of Amendment 2, which modifies the Missouri Constitution to permit legalized sports wagering. The amendment directs the Missouri Gaming Commission to regulate sports wagering by imposing a 10% tax on sports betting revenue. The funds are allocated to cover expenses incurred by the MGC, support the Compulsive Gaming Prevention Fund, and support elementary, secondary, and higher education in the state. The amendment allows for 19 retail licenses and 14 mobile licenses. The Missouri Gaming Commission is charged with making sports betting available no later than December 1, 2025. With the passage of this constitutional amendment, Missouri became the 39th state to legalize sports betting.

While the MGC staff had already begun research and drafting sports wagering rules in anticipation of its passage, the ratified amendment provided the direction needed to move forward officially. In what would soon be called the "war room," the MGC rule-writing team spent countless days, nights, weekends, and even holidays hashing out the details of every rule. This incredible team, consisting of Cheryl Alonzo, Nikki Evans, Leshia Kempker, Heather Berhorst, and Seth Brown, deserves high praise for their outstanding contributions in making sports wagering a reality in Missouri.

Aside from the significant preparation and time commitment to sports wagering, day-to-day operations to regulate Missouri casinos, charitable gaming organizations, and fantasy sports contests continued without interruption. Financial figures indicate Missouri's casinos continue to be a consistent and significant boost to the state's economy. One of the most important functions of the MGC is monitoring the collection of Admissions Fees and the gaming tax on AGR or Adjusted Gross Receipts. FY2025 saw year-over-year AGR up 1%, while Admissions were down 2% compared to FY2024. I would like to thank our partners in the casino industry for their continued collaboration, as we work together to maintain the fairness and security of gaming operations in Missouri.

The Missouri Gaming Commission takes great pride in its contributions to worthy causes and education. FY2025 money to worthy causes from Admission Fees totaled just over \$18 million. The worthy causes are the Veterans Commission Capital Improvement Trust Fund, the Missouri National Guard Trust Fund, the MO College Guarantee/Access Missouri Financial Assistance Fund, and the Compulsive Gambler's Fund. Since the inception of the MGC, money to worthy causes has surpassed \$1 billion. Money to education from the Gaming Tax on AGR in FY2025 totaled more than \$361 million.

Another facet of the MGC is the regulation of bingo and fantasy sports contests. FY2025 shows a slight decline in charitable bingo operators, which now stands at 162 organizations. Missouri gained four fantasy sports operators, bringing the total to 14 in the state.

I would like to express my sincere appreciation to the Missouri State Highway Patrol Gaming Division for their partnership with the MGC. Gaming agents enforce regulations within casinos, while investigators aid us in licensing the employees and companies we regulate. We could not do our jobs without them.

I am incredibly proud of the entire Missouri Gaming Commission staff for their consistent dedication to ensuring the integrity of gaming. I would be remiss if I didn't thank Executive Director Michael Leara and Deputy Director Kevin Bond for their diligence with the daily operations of the MGC. I would also like to extend my sincere gratitude to my fellow commissioners. Their commitment to public service is immeasurable, and they consistently prioritize the best interests of Missourians in every decision they make.

### Jan M. Zimmerman, Chairman

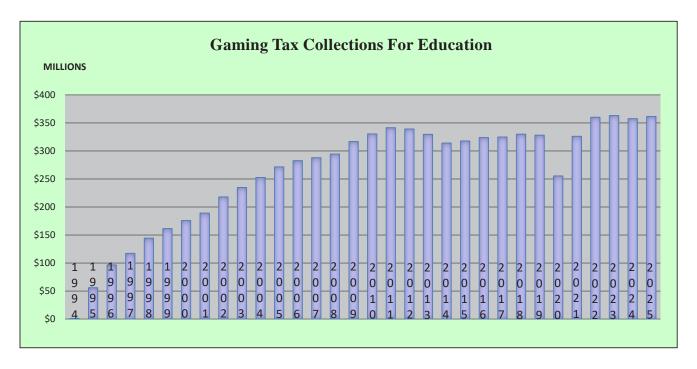

## Gaming Proceeds for Education Fund

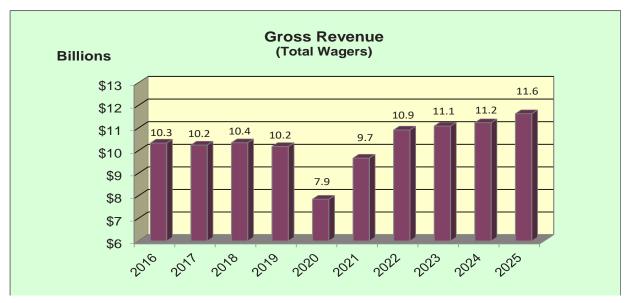
(from Gaming Tax)

Pursuant to Section 313.822, RSMo., Missouri's 13 casinos pay a Gaming Tax of 21% on their Adjusted Gross Revenue (wagers made-winnings paid). Ten percent of taxes collected is paid to the home dock city or county where each casino is located. The remaining 90% is paid to the State of Missouri Gaming Proceeds for Education Fund. As reflected in the chart below, Missouri's casinos have contributed \$8,405,108,447 to education since inception, including \$361,635,852 for FY2025.

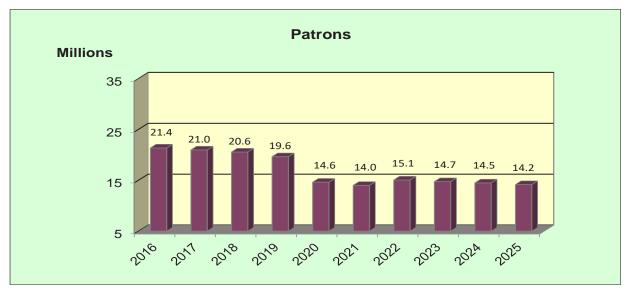

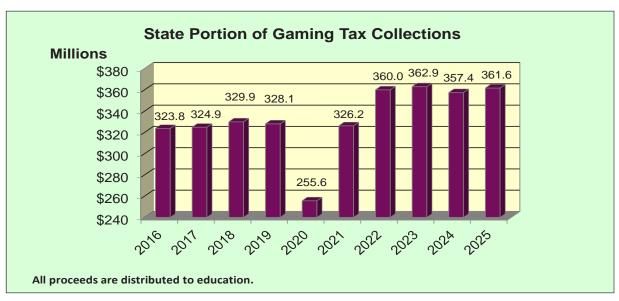

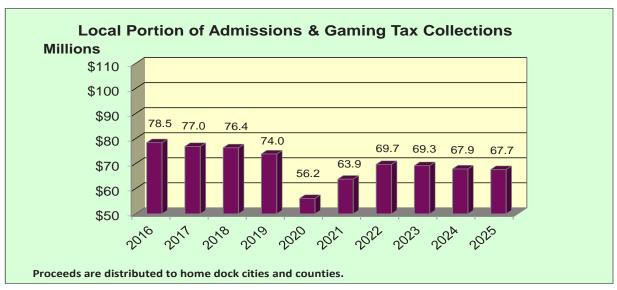

### Charitable Gaming

Charitable Gaming includes licensed bingo and other associated games such as pull-tabs, merchandise coin boards, and event tickets. Bingo was legalized in 1980 and came under the Missouri Gaming Commission on July 1, 1994. The operation of bingo and the other associated games is restricted to qualified licensed religious, charitable, fraternal, veteran, and service organizations. The Charitable Games Division also licenses hall providers, suppliers, and manufacturers of bingo products.

All proceeds over and above the actual cost of conducting bingo must be used for charitable, religious, or philanthropic purposes of the organization, and no part of the net earnings may inure to the benefit of any individual member of the organization. Bingo proceeds collected by these tax-exempt organizations are used to fund various projects such as veterans homes, drug awareness programs, prevention of child abuse, cancer care and research, Alzheimer's care and research, Boy & Girl Scouts, various religious organizations, scholarships, sight and hearing care for impoverished citizens, and many more.

More than \$100 million has been generated in tax revenue since bingo was legalized. The chart below represents the actual tax reported for bingo paper and pull-tabs for the past five fiscal years. All bingo tax is deposited into the Proceeds for Education Fund. A comparison of tax paid per file period shows a slight decline in the overall taxes reported for bingo paper and pull-tab sales combined.

The above chart shows the annual operation fees and annual license renewal fees deposited during the last four fiscal years. The annual operation fees are due on November 1st of the following year. The annual renewal fee for each licensee is \$0, \$1,000, \$2,500, or \$5,000 based on net revenues. These fees are paid to the Gaming Commission fund.

## Missouri State Highway Patrol

The Gaming Division was established on May 1, 1994, by order of Colonel Fred M. Mills and was the first new division established within the Patrol since the creation of the Division of Drug and Crime Control in 1983. Officers assigned to the division conduct investigations and enforcement functions necessary to assist with regulating legal gaming activities in Missouri.

Under terms established by a memorandum of understanding, the Patrol's Gaming Division works in concert with the Missouri Gaming Commission to license and regulate constitutionally permitted gaming activities in the state. The division is part of the Patrol's Criminal Investigation Bureau and is under the command of Captain Andrew O. Tourney. The division is divided into Administrative Services, Investigations, Eastern and Western District Enforcement.

The Administrative Services Section, under the direction of Lieutenant Kevin J. Hunter, is responsible for administrative aspects of division operations, including supervision of Administrative Support Professionals and the property control supervisor, fleet management, training, criminal records, overtime, recruiting, personnel actions, and special projects.

The Investigative Unit, under the direction of Lieutenant Shawn M. Griggs, conducts comprehensive background investigations of individuals and corporate entities seeking licensures from the Missouri Gaming Commission. The individuals and entities subject to background investigation are specified in 11CSR45-4, and the results of completed investigations are used by the Missouri Gaming Commission when evaluating their suitability for licensing. Additionally, the unit assists the Missouri Gaming Commission with investigations related to licensed charitable gaming and fantasy sports operations in the state.

Lieutenant Jody T. Laramore and Lieutenant Jeffery T. Fitzgerald direct enforcement operations in the eastern and western districts of the state. Officers assigned to the Enforcement Section conduct investigations into violations of Missouri Gaming Commission regulations and investigate and arrest individuals for violations of criminal law. Results of regulatory investigations are referred to the Missouri Gaming Commission for administrative action, while violations of criminal law are referred to the prosecuting attorney.

All four sections of the Patrol's Gaming Division are provided with clerical support from Administrative Support Professional Ms. Rachel M. Thowe and Administrative Support Assistant Ms. Stacy Slayton. Their responsibilities include processing criminal investigation reports and similar administrative tasks.

The Gaming Division's proactive approach and collaboration with the Missouri Gaming Commission reflects a commitment to ensuring the integrity of licensed gaming activities and contributing to the safety of those who live in and visit the state.
