

COMMISSION RESOLUTION NO. 16-018  
REGARDING EXCLUSION OF AN INDIVIDUAL FROM  
EXCURSION GAMBLING BOATS AND FACILITIES IN MISSOURI

APRIL 27, 2016

WHEREAS, pursuant to 11 CSR 45-15.030 the Missouri Gaming Commission (the "Commission") has the authority to place a person on the Exclusion List for conviction of a felony in any jurisdiction of any crime involving morale turpitude or of a crime involving gaming, violating any provision of Chapter 313, RSMo, or any rule promulgated by the Missouri Gaming Commission, or performing any act or having a notorious or unsavory reputation which would adversely affect public confidence and trust in gaming; or has their name on any valid and current exclusion list from another jurisdiction in the United States; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to 11 CSR 45-15.010, placement on the Exclusion List prohibits such person from entering or having contact of any kind with any Missouri riverboat gaming operation; and

WHEREAS, Alfred Brown, pled guilty on May 5, 2015, and was convicted on August 11, 2015, in The United States District Court Eastern District of Missouri of one felony count of Filing a False Tax Return, a felony involving moral turpitude. He was sentenced to 12 months and one day in prison, supervised probation of 1 year and restitution of \$99,038.00. Mr. Brown was the pastor for the Church of Jesus Christ in St. Louis, Missouri. During a time period between 2007 and 2010, Mr. Brown withdrew extensive amounts of cash from the church's bank accounts, including substantial amounts withdrawn at casinos, and failed to report those items as income on his tax returns.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Commission hereby finds that Alfred Brown is eligible for permanent placement on the Exclusion List, and the Commission directs the Executive Director to issue a Notice of Exclusion to Alfred Brown.
