2 CHAIRMAN ZIMMERMAN: Good morning and welcome,
3 everyone, to the February meeting of the Missouri Gaming
4 Commission. I hope everyone's been surviving the bitter cold
5 and snow that we've had the last couple of weeks. It was
6 definitely better traveling down here this time than it has
7 been.

8 Before we get started, I want to just give a shout out
9 to the Staff here on all the hard work they've been doing for
10 the past several weeks getting those rules put together for
11 sports wagering. I know that they've worked some nights,
12 they've worked some weekends and some holidays, so I truly
13 appreciate all the effort that the crew has been putting in.

14 I'll now call the February 26, 2025 Missouri Gaming
15 Commission meeting to order. Angie, would you call the roll?

16 MS. FRANKS: Chairman Zimmerman?

17 CHAIRMAN ZIMMERMAN: Present.

18 MS. FRANKS: Commissioner Conway?

19 COMMISSIONER CONWAY: Present.

20 MS. FRANKS: Commissioner Hane?

21 COMMISSIONER HANE: Present.

22 MS. FRANKS: Commissioner Spaulding?

23 COMMISSIONER SPAULDING: Present.

24 CHAIRMAN ZIMMERMAN: All right, we have a quorum.
25 Let's get started.

1 We'll start this morning with Team Member Recognition
2 and the very prestigious Highway Patrol Gaming Officer of the
3 Year award. I believe Captain Andy Tourney is going to be
4 making the presentation this morning.

5 CAPTAIN TOURNEY: Chairman, Commissioners, Directors,
6 thank you for this time.

7 Each year, the Gaming Division asks the supervisors to
8 nominate an officer of the year. We call it the Ace Award.
9 The award comes from the 13-unit supervisors across the state,
10 and it goes to an award committee. And the award committee is
11 made up of peers, and it is not -- it doesn't come to the
12 staff. We keep our mitts out of it, so to speak, so it is an
13 award of the peers, and that's important to know.

14 This year's award recipient is Todd Barthelmass. A
15 little about Todd, he was appointed to the patrol on July 1,
16 1996, was assigned to the St. Louis region for Road
17 Operations. He transferred in the Gaming Division in 2007,
18 was promoted to corporal that same year. He was then promoted
19 to sergeant in 2012.

20 He is a 28-year veteran of the patrol and a 17-year
21 member of the Gaming Division. He's currently assigned to
22 Ameristar in St. Charles and Hollywood in Maryland Heights.

23 A little about Todd, he is very industrious. He is
24 always engaged. He's the guy that's listening to the radio
25 coming to work, going home from work. If there is anything

1 going on anywhere near Todd, he's going to be there to help.

2 He's always been like that. He's well known throughout
3 St. Louis. He's just a relentless officer. To be frank, you
4 just don't want Todd out looking for you. He's one of those
5 guys.

6 This is not a small thing for an officer with 28 years
7 of service. We have a tendency to slow down a little bit, and
8 Todd has not slowed down. He is not running on fumes. He is
9 the same guy he was coming out of the Academy, and you can
10 make the argument that he's fresh like that.

11 So I did want to read something from the nominations,
12 just a little blurb about something he's done this year.
13 Number one, Sergeant Barthelmass always goes above and beyond
14 when investigating crimes and regulatory matters.

15 And a great example of Todd's tenacity, without going
16 too much into the investigation because I think it's still
17 being investigated at some level, early in 2004, Sergeant
18 Barthelmass initiated a money laundering and conspiracy case
19 with multiple nationwide victims totaling over two million
20 dollars in financial loss.

21 The case began as a cheating investigation at Ameristar
22 St. Charles. Using available resources, he was able to
23 identify the original suspects and identify additional
24 suspects. He disseminated the intelligence information to the
25 gaming troopers across the state, and the suspects were active

1 at many other locations across this state.

2 The investigation exposed a network of individuals from
3 a foreign country conspiring to gain millions in stolen funds
4 and filter them through the casinos around the nation.
5 Without his investigation and inquiries, the network probably
6 would have gone undiscovered. The FBI has adopted this case
7 for prosecution in the Eastern District.

8 Cases like that require a lot of coordination with a
9 lot of different agencies when it's a course of conduct that
10 spans a lot of states. Just a few, between the MIAC here in
11 Missouri and the National Gambling Intelligence Sharing Group,
12 Illinois State Police, Illinois Gaming Enforcement, Indiana
13 Gaming Enforcement, Pennsylvania State Police, California
14 Bureau of Gambling Control and the FBI, those were all people
15 he had to coordinate with.

16 So with those nice things being said, Todd, if you
17 would join me up here, sir. One might think that this award
18 is about this case, and it's really not. It's about a hard-
19 working officer that has put himself in harm's way many times
20 over the years.

21 And, Todd, your dedication and service has earned you
22 the respect of a lot of people across the state, so it's my
23 privilege to give you this award.

24 SERGEANT BARTHELMASS: Thank you.

25 [ROUND OF APPLAUSE AND STANDING OVATION]

1 CAPTAIN TOURNEY: Thank you.

2 CHAIRMAN ZIMMERMAN: Congratulations, Todd, for your
3 years of service to the MGC and to the citizens of the State
4 of Missouri.

14 Licensure of Certain Key and Level I Applicants, Resolution
15 25-022. Sergeant Jason McTheeney, you have the floor.

16 SERGEANT MCTHEENEY: Good morning, Chairman and
17 Commissioners. Missouri State Highway Patrol Investigators
18 and Missouri Gaming Commission Financial Analysts conducted
19 comprehensive background investigations on Key and Level I
20 applicants.

21 The investigations included, but were not limited to,
22 civil, criminal, financial, and general character inquiries
23 that were made in the jurisdictions where the applicants have
24 lived, worked, and frequented.

4 any questions for Sergeant McTheeney? Pat? Apparently that's
5 no. All right, thank you, sir.

6 COMMISSIONER CONWAY: No, not at this time.

7 CHAIRMAN ZIMMERMAN: Okay, thank you. I move to
8 approve Resolution 25-022. Is there a second?

9 COMMISSIONER CONWAY: Second.

10 CHAIRMAN ZIMMERMAN: Any further discussion? Angie,

20 MS. FRANKS: By your vote, you've adopted Resolution
21 Number 25-022.

22 CHAIRMAN ZIMMERMAN: Next we have Consideration of
23 Relicensure of Certain Key Persons Licensees, Resolution
24 25-023. I believe Corporal Don Doza has that presentation
25 this morning.

1 CORPORAL DOZA: Good morning, Chairman and
2 Commissioners.

3 Missouri State Highway Patrol Investigators conducted
4 background investigation updates on Key Person License
5 renewals. The investigations included an application review
6 as well as civil, criminal, and general character inquiries
7 made in the jurisdictions where the applicants currently
8 reside.

9 The following renewals are being presented for your
10 consideration.

25 Investigative findings were provided to the Missouri

1 Gaming Commission Staff for their review, and I will answer
2 any questions you might have. Thank you.

3 CHAIRMAN ZIMMERMAN: I have no questions. Are there
4 any questions for Corporal Doza? All right, thank you.

5 I move to approve Resolution 25-023. Is there a
6 second?

7 COMMISSIONER HANE: Second.

8 CHAIRMAN ZIMMERMAN: Any further discussion? Angie,
9 would you call the roll?

10 MS. FRANKS: Chairman Zimmerman?

11 CHAIRMAN ZIMMERMAN: Approved.

12 MS. FRANKS: Commissioner Conway?

13 COMMISSIONER CONWAY: Approved.

14 MS. FRANKS: Commissioner Hane?

18 MS. FRANKS: By your vote, you've adopted Resolution
19 Number 25-023.

20 CHAIRMAN ZIMMERMAN: Next on the agenda we have
21 consideration of Relicensure of Certain Suppliers, Landry
22 Holdings, LLC, doing business as CasinoTech, Resolution
23 25-024. Sergeant John Masters will be making the
24 presentation. Sergeant, you have the floor.

25 SERGEANT MASTERS: Thank you. Good morning, Chairman

1 Zimmerman and Commissioners.

2 Missouri State Highway Patrol Investigators, along with
3 MGC Financial Analysts, conducted a relicensing investigation
4 of Landry Holdings, LLC, doing business as CasinoTech, which
5 has been licensed as a supplier in the State of Missouri since
6 2015.

7 This investigation consisted of, but was not limited
8 to, gaming jurisdictional inquiries, feedback from Missouri
9 casinos, a review of financial information, disciplinary
10 actions, litigation, and business credit profiles, as well as
11 a review of key persons associated with CasinoTech.

12 The result of this investigation was provided to the
13 MGC Staff for their review, and investigating officers are
14 available to answer any questions you might have at this time.
15 Thank you.

16 CHAIRMAN ZIMMERMAN: Sergeant Masters, I just had one
17 question, maybe just a clarification. There was discussion in
18 the report about a reduction in revenue maybe directly related
19 to a reduction in sales staff, they weren't able to go out and
20 sell the product and so they had a pretty significant
21 reduction in revenue.

22 SERGEANT MASTERS: Yeah, that was in -- right after
23 Covid, I believe.

24 CHAIRMAN ZIMMERMAN: Uh-huh.

25 SERGEANT MASTERS: Yeah.

1 CHAIRMAN ZIMMERMAN: Thank you. I just want to make
2 sure I understood that the right way. Any other questions for
3 Sergeant Masters? Seeing none, okay, thank you, Sergeant
4 Masters.

5 I move to approve supplier CasinoTech, Resolution
6 25-024. Is there a second?

7 COMMISSIONER SPAULDING: Second.

8 CHAIRMAN ZIMMERMAN: Any further discussion? Angie,
9 would you call the roll?

10 MS. FRANKS: Chairman Zimmerman?

11 CHAIRMAN ZIMMERMAN: Approved.

12 MS. FRANKS: Commissioner Conway?

13 COMMISSIONER CONWAY: Approved.

14 MS. FRANKS: Commissioner Hane?

15 COMMISSIONER HANE: Approved.

16 MS. FRANKS: Commissioner Spaulding?

17 COMMISSIONER SPAULDING: Approved.

18 MS. FRANKS: By your vote, you've adopted Resolution
19 Number 25-024.

20 CHAIRMAN ZIMMERMAN: Next we have Consideration of
21 Licensure of Fantasy Sports Operators. We'll hear from
22 Corporal Don Doza. Corporal, you have the floor again.

23 CORPORAL DOZA: Chairman and Commissioners, I'm
24 presenting a Fantasy Sports Operator for licensing in the
25 State of Missouri. The investigation included a business

1 credit profile, financial review, Missouri tax clearance, as
2 well as a review of litigation and open source data.

3 The following Fantasy Sports Operator is being
4 presented for your consideration.

5 Certamen Games, LLC does business as Splash Sports.

6 The results of this investigation was provided to the
7 Missouri Gaming Commission Staff for their review, and I would
8 be glad to answer any questions you might have. Thank you.

9 CHAIRMAN ZIMMERMAN: Any questions for Corporal Doza?
10 All right, seeing none, thank you, Corporal. Thank you.

11 I move to approve Fantasy Sports Operator, Certamen
12 Games, LLC, Resolution Number 25-025. Is there a second?

13 COMMISSIONER HANE: Second.

14 CHAIRMAN ZIMMERMAN: Any further discussion? Angie,
15 would you call the roll?

16 MS. FRANKS: Chairman Zimmerman?

17 CHAIRMAN ZIMMERMAN: Approved.

18 MS. FRANKS: Commissioner Conway?

19 COMMISSIONER CONWAY: Approved.

20 MS. FRANKS: Commissioner Hane?

21 COMMISSIONER HANE: Approved.

22 MS. FRANKS: Commissioner Spaulding?

23 COMMISSIONER SPAULDING: Approved.

24 MS. FRANKS: By your vote, you've adopted Resolution
25 Number 25-025.

1 CHAIRMAN ZIMMERMAN: Our next item of business is
2 Consideration of Disciplinary Action for St. Louis Gaming
3 Ventures, LLC, doing business as Hollywood Casino St. Louis,
4 DC-25-010. Tom Venneman, Deputy General Counsel, will be
5 making the presentation. Good morning, Tom.

6 MR. VENNEMAN: Good morning. Good morning, Chairman
7 and Commissioners.

8 Under Tab H we have a Preliminary Order of Discipline
9 directed at St. Louis Gaming Ventures, LLC, doing business as
10 Hollywood Casino St. Louis.

11 The proposed discipline arises from a violation
12 discovered when the Director of Regulatory Compliance at the
13 casino contacted the Commission regarding an error in one of
14 their promotions that affected 273 patrons.

15 On January 1, 2024, the casino ran a promotion called
16 *15K VIP Cheers to the New Year Drawing*. This promotion
17 awarded one entry for swiping a player card at a kiosk during
18 the proposed promotional time period and awarded additional
19 entries for game play throughout the promotion.

20 Due to human error, the game play entries were not
21 awarded prior to the promotional drawings. This error
22 resulted in each eligible patron being deprived of their
23 additional earned entries and chances to win prizes.

24 Because of this error, the casino failed to follow its
25 own rules for a promotional giveaway in violation of 11 CSR

1 45-5.181.

2 The Disciplinary Review Board recommended a \$5,000 fine
3 in this matter. The casino does not contest this fine and has
4 taken the following steps. Hollywood honored the prizes to
5 patrons during the original drawing. Marketing staff
6 contacted the 273 patrons who participated in the promotion
7 and issued each patron \$55 in slot play, totaling \$15,000.
8 And management implemented a two-team member verification
9 process to lessen the chances of this error recurring.

10 I'm happy to answer any questions the Commission may
11 have at this time.

12 CHAIRMAN ZIMMERMAN: And I understand, Tom, that the
13 individual who was involved in this has since resigned?

14 MR. VENNEMAN: Yeah, the team member resigned his
15 position, or their position, prior to discovery of this
16 violation, so they are no longer in charge of these
17 promotions.

18 CHAIRMAN ZIMMERMAN: Okay, thank you.

19 COMMISSIONER SPAULDING: And they self-reported; is
20 that right?

21 MR. VENNEMAN: They did, yes, they self-reported to the
22 Missouri Gaming Commission on this matter.

23 CHAIRMAN ZIMMERMAN: Any other questions for
24 Mr. Venneman? Pat, anything? I'll take that as a no.

25 COMMISSIONER CONWAY: well, I think -- I think it's in

1 line.

2 CHAIRMAN ZIMMERMAN: Okay, thank you. I move to
3 approve DC-25-010. Is there a second?

4 COMMISSIONER CONWAY: Second.

5 THE COURT: Any further discussion? Angie, would you
6 call the roll?

7 MS. FRANKS: Chairman Zimmerman?

8 CHAIRMAN ZIMMERMAN: Approved.

9 MS. FRANKS: Commissioner Conway?

10 COMMISSIONER CONWAY: Approved.

11 MS. FRANKS: Commissioner Hane?

12 COMMISSIONER HANE: Approved.

13 MS. FRANKS: Commissioner Spaulding?

14 COMMISSIONER SPAULDING: Approved.

15 MS. FRANKS: By your vote, you've adopted DC-25-010.

16 CHAIRMAN ZIMMERMAN: Our next item of business is
17 Consideration of Disciplinary Action for IOC-Boonville, doing
18 business as Isle of Capri, Boonville, DC-25-011.
19 Mr. Venneman, you still have the floor.

20 MR. VENNEMAN: Thank you. Under Tab I, we have a
21 Preliminary Order of Discipline directed at IOC-Boonville,
22 Inc., doing business as Isle of Capri Casino, Boonville.

23 The proposed discipline arises from three separate
24 violations regarding promotions held at the casino.

25 On March 23, 2024, the casino ran a promotion called

1 *OTP-The Big Pull*. This promotion awarded one entry upon
2 activation during the promotional time period and awarded
3 additional entries for game play throughout the promotion.

4 Due to an error, the game play entries were not awarded
5 prior to the promotional drawings. This error resulted in
6 each eligible patron being deprived of their additional earned
7 entries and chances to win prizes.

8 Additionally, on April 19, 2024, the casino ran a
9 promotion called *Petals That Pay Drawing*. This promotion
10 awarded one entry upon activation during the promotional time
11 period and awarded additional entries for game play throughout
12 the promotion.

13 Due to an error, some of the game play entries were not
14 awarded prior to the promotional drawings. This error
15 resulted in each eligible patron being deprived of their
16 additional earned entries and chances to win prizes.

17 During the month of May 2024, the casino ran a
18 promotion called *Love our Locals*. This promotion awarded
19 earned credits for game play that could be used to redeem free
20 slot play each week.

21 Due to an error, none of the credits were awarded for
22 table play during the promotion. This error resulted in
23 eligible patrons being deprived of their free slot play as
24 stated in the promotional rules.

25 During all three of these promotional events, the

1 casino failed to follow its own rules for promotional
2 giveaways in violation of 11 CSR 45-5.181.

3 The Disciplinary Review Board recommended a \$15,000
4 fine in these combined matters. The casino does not contest
5 the violations but did request a review of the fine amount.

6 The Missouri Gaming Commission Disciplinary Review
7 Board reviewed the violations and determined that the
8 recommended fine was appropriate in this case based on the
9 similar repeated violations.

10 Reflected in a letter sent to the Missouri Gaming
11 Commission, Isle of Capri wants to assure the Commission that
12 IOC-Boonville prides itself on adhering to MGC's regulatory
13 requirements and in situations such as these, work diligently
14 to identify and report issues, remediate those issues and
15 implement procedures to mitigate future risk.

16 Isle of Capri Casino has taken appropriate steps to
17 notify the affected patrons and made good faith restitution
18 where possible.

19 I'm happy to answer any questions at this time.

20 CHAIRMAN ZIMMERMAN: Not so much a question, just as
21 maybe a repeat of what you've already stated, that the amount
22 of the fine based on the repeated violations and the number of
23 patrons that were impacted by those back-to-back violations,
24 so if they had been handled separately, obviously --

25 MR. VENNEMAN: Yes. We took each one of those

1 instances and discussed them separately and assessed our fine
2 while looking at the facts of each case.

3 CHAIRMAN ZIMMERMAN: And to Commissioner Spaulding's
4 question earlier, did they self-report in this instance? I
5 don't recall.

6 MR. VENNEMAN: So, yes, they did self-report.

7 COMMISSIONER HANE: In March, a patron reported to the
8 Marketing Supervisor, and then that prompted them to --

9 MR. VENNEMAN: So you may have sensed some hesitation
10 in my response when they self-reported. They did in fact
11 self-report to Missouri Gaming Commission, but typically when
12 they do self-report, it's because a patron has made a
13 complaint to them, and then they will report to us.

14 So if the patron did not complain to Missouri Gaming
15 Commission directly, we would not likely have discovered that
16 these violations had occurred, so they did in fact self-report
17 to MGC.

18 CHAIRMAN ZIMMERMAN: Any other questions for
19 Mr. Venneman? Pat, did you have anything?

20 COMMISSIONER CONWAY: No, I just -- I think you made an
21 excellent point that the previous one was -- the previous fine
22 we levied at Hollywood was an individual incident, and this
23 was three times the individual incident; so I think it's an
24 appropriate amount for the fine.

25 CHAIRMAN ZIMMERMAN: Thank you. Seeing no other

1 questions for Mr. Venneman, I move to approve DC-25-011. Is
2 there a second?

3 COMMISSIONER SPAULDING: Second.

4 CHAIRMAN ZIMMERMAN: Any further discussion? Angie,
5 would you call the roll?

6 MS. FRANKS: Chairman Zimmerman?

7 CHAIRMAN ZIMMERMAN: Approved.

8 MS. FRANKS: Commissioner Conway?

9 COMMISSIONER CONWAY: Approved.

10 MS. FRANKS: Commissioner Hane?

11 COMMISSIONER HANE: Approved.

12 MS. FRANKS: Commissioner Spaulding?

13 COMMISSIONER SPAULDING: Approved.

14 MS. FRANKS: By your vote, you've adopted DC-25-011.

15 CHAIRMAN ZIMMERMAN: We are now to the portion of our
16 agenda designated for public comments per 11 CSR 45-2.010
17 RSMo. We've received no written petitions to speak at the
18 meeting today, so we'll move on from public comments.

19 That completes all of the items on our agenda today, so
20 I make a motion to adjourn the February 26, 2025 meeting of
21 the Missouri Gaming Commission. Is there second?

22 COMMISSIONER HANE: Second.

23 CHAIRMAN ZIMMERMAN: Any further discussion? Angie,
24 would you call the roll?
